## Out to Innovate™ Scholarships for LGBTQ+ Students in Science Technology Engineering and Math

The Out to Innovate™ Scholarships for LGBTQ+ STEM Students were established by NOGLSTP, following NOGLSTP's inaugural Out to Innovate™ Career Summit for LGBTQ+ People in STEM in 2010. These scholarships are intended for undergraduate and graduate students pursuing degrees in science, technology, engineering, or mathematics (STEM) programs who identify as lesbian, gay, bi/pansexual, transgender, ace or queer or who are an active ally of the LGBTQ+ community. The scholarships are designed to promote academic excellence and increased visibility of talented LGBTQ+ students in STEM careers.

### The Out to Innovate™ Scholarships mission is to:

- **Award scholarships** to LGBTQ+ students currently enrolled in Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics (STEM) or STEM-related teaching fields.
- **Honor students** who support a creative educational community that increases the visibility and the accomplishments of LGBTQ+ students
- **Encourage students to be out** in their careers and support diversity in the STEM workforce

### Scholarship Awards:

A minimum of two \$5000 scholarships are awarded for the academic year. One \$5000 scholarship goes to an undergraduate student, and one \$5000 scholarship goes to a graduate/professional level student. Students currently enrolled at any U.S.-based college or university are eligible to apply.

### Award Guidelines:

- Scholarship awards will be paid in the Fall semester/quarter only, for the academic year.
- Scholarships must be used in the academic year awarded.
- Scholarships might not be available every year.
- Scholarships must be used for educational expenses only, which include tuition, textbooks, e-textbook subscriptions, educational supplies, research supplies, registration for professional meetings at which the awardee is presenting a poster or talk, travel/accommodations for professional meetings at which the awardee is presenting a poster or talk.

### Eligibility:

- Successful completion of a minimum of two years of post-high school education at an accredited U.S. college, university, or community college.
- Maintenance of a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 (on 4-point scale) for the entirety of college/university enrollment
- A declared major in an accredited STEM program or STEM-related teaching field
- Be an active supporter of and participant in programs or organizations that promote LGBTQ+ inclusion and visibility
- Students must be eligible for fall term registration and must not be under disciplinary sanction.

### Application packages must be submitted by the first Saturday of June:

### Application Package:

Applications will be accepted April 1 through the first Saturday of June each year. The link for on-line application submission will be found on our website during the acceptance window.

We do not accept applications outside of the acceptance window.

A complete application package will contain:

- application form which includes
  - personal information
  - academic and community achievements
  - demographics survey
  - coursework / program summary
  - work experience
  - awards/honors
  - community and extracurricular activities
  - financial aid profile
  - list of references
  - personal statement (essay)
  - waiver agreements (allowing the selection committee to look at your academic records and application content, and allowing NOGLSTP to publicize your name and photo if you are selected)
- official transcript(s)
- three letters of reference
